Remember...

1

The posting of a presentation or poster online is considered a form of publication under UK copyright law.

2

It requires more stringent adherence to image re-use guidelines than internal/academic use.

3

The easiest way to enable public sharing via WRaP is to remove any third party copyrighted content.

4

Any figures you do keep in there will need explicit copyright permission and labels.

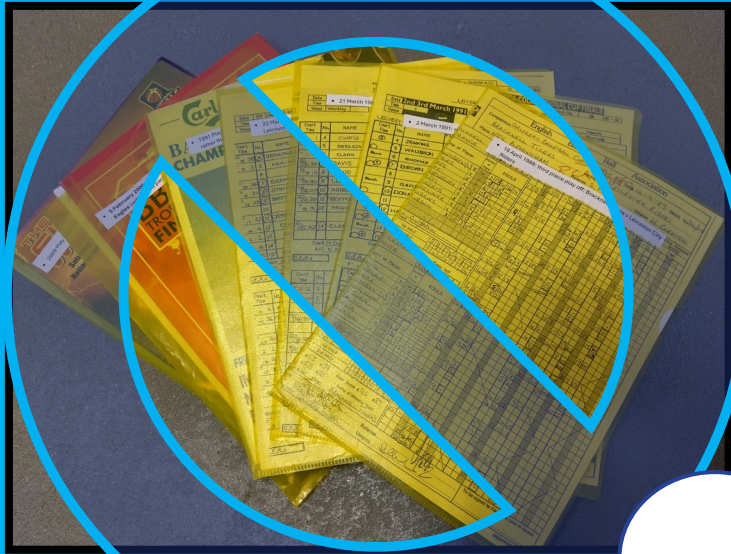

Figures created by someone else with attribution labels, but without permissions details

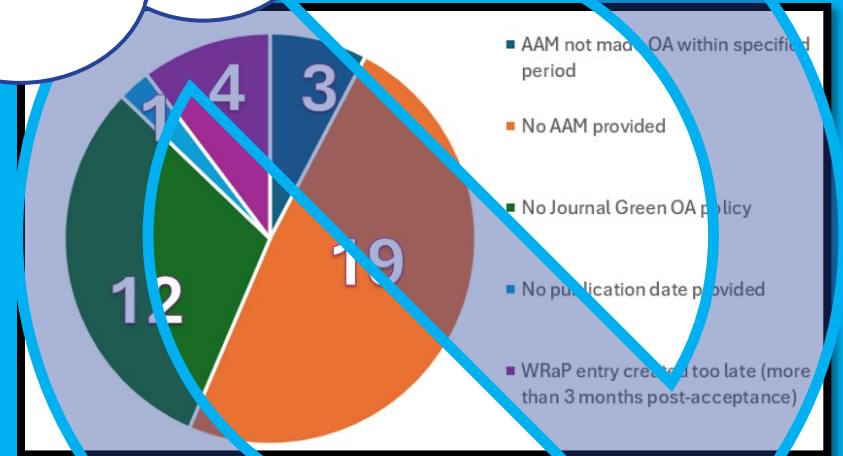


Figure 2: Small, K. (2025) WRaP Presentation.



How do I include... My own images

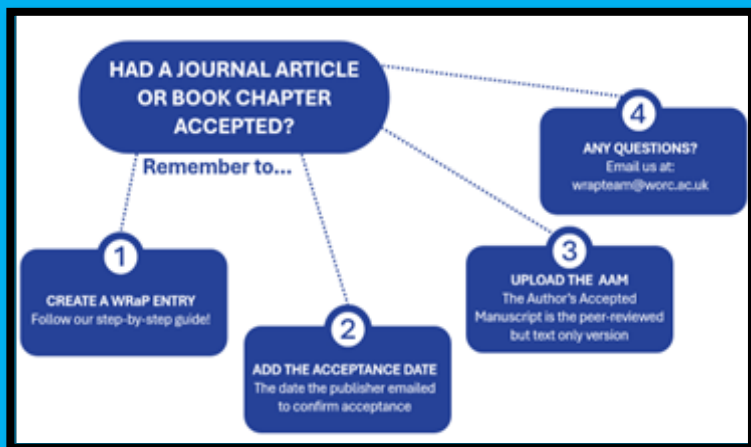


Figure 4: Author's Own Creation, 2024

If you are using a photo you took yourself, or a figure/diagram you created, you don't need to seek permissions – but you do need to include a caption attributing the figure to the author.

How do I include...

Stock Photos



Be careful of sites like iStock and Adobe Stock, which require paid licenses.

Only use stock photo sites which apply a [CC0](#) (or public domain equivalent) license, such as:

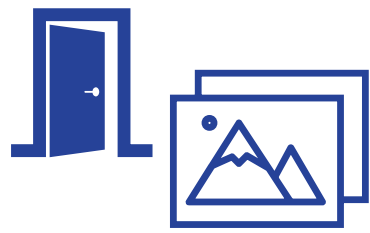

How do I include... Creative Commons

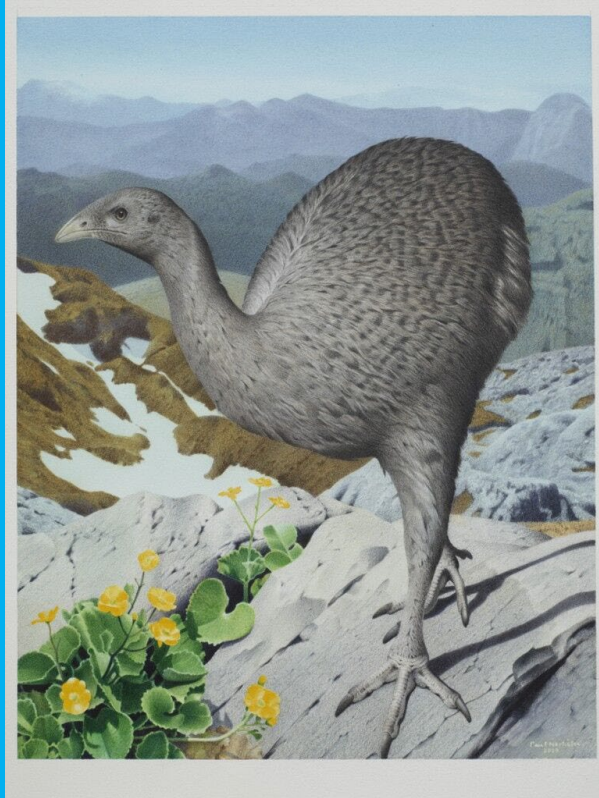


Figure 7: Image by Paul Martinson. Upland Moa. From: *Extinct Birds of New Zealand*. 2005. Image and data from Museum of New Zealand - Te Papa Tongarewa. (Available under the [CC BY-NC-ND 4.0 license](#); found via [JSTOR](#)).

Creative Commons (CC) licenses give users the right to copy, distribute, and sometimes adapt the content, provided they follow the rules for the specific license type (check these online for the [six different license types](#)).

Often museums will publish material with CC licenses; these can be searched at [Public Domain Image Archive](#).

How do I include... Other people's work



If you are using photos someone else has taken, figures someone else has made, or work from a published book or article, you must seek permission.

Email the creator to ask for permission to include the material publicly on WRaP; forward the reply to library-research@worc.ac.uk and label the figure as shown.

Journals sometimes have a [Copyright Clearance Center](#) function which you can use to gain permission.

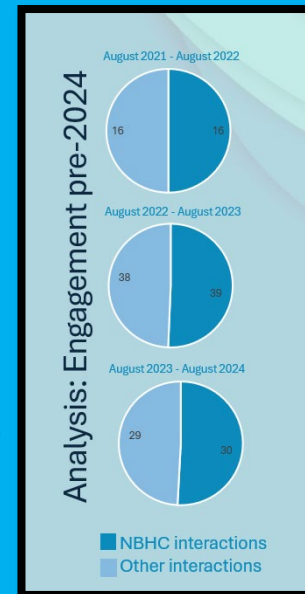

What do I do if... I can't gain permission



If you cannot gain written permission to use the figure, the image can be redacted or removed.

A link or description of the missing image can be added if needed, to aid understanding by the reader.
